## CITY OF BELFAST CHAMPIONSHIP 1-2 APRIL 2000

This event attracted 32 players, including four past and present Ulster champions. Top seed Tom Clarke was the only player with full points after three rounds but then losses in the next two rounds to Steve Scannell and Richard McMaster put him out of contention. Going into the final round Scannel and McMaster, who had drawn with each other in Round 3, were in the lead with $41 / 2$ points, with Nicholas Pilkiewicz next on 4 . McMaster had on paper the easiest task of the three leaders in the last round, being rated over 400 points better than his opponent Tony Parker, but in the end he had a very hard struggle before scoring the full point. North Belfast team-mates Scannell and Pilkiewicz were paired against each other and it was the latter who eventually won in a game that went down to the last minute of the playing session.

Leading final scores: $1^{\text {st }}$ Richard McMaster $51 / 2 / 6 ; 2^{\text {nd }}$ Nicholas Pilkiewicz 5; $3^{\text {rd }}$ equal Steve Scannell and Neil Fisher (who had an excellent last round win against former Ulster champion Michael Holmes) $41 / 2$ (Scannell took the $3^{\text {rd }}$ place prize on tie-break but Fisher had the consolation of winning the under 1800 rating prize); $5^{\text {th }}$ equal Tom Clarke, Kieran Greer, David Robb and Mark Newman 4; 9 th equal Michael Holmes, Des Moreland, Tony Parker (who took the under 1650 rating prize), Stephen McCann and Alan Burns $\mathbf{3}^{1 ⁄ 2}$.

Although the tournament was run in one section the Junior (under 1450) competitors had their own prize list and here David Collins and lan Woodfield shared $1^{\text {st }}$ with 3 points with David O'Donnell taking $3^{\text {rd }}$ prize on $\mathbf{2}^{1 / 2}$.

## FISHERWICK TOURNAMENT 1999/2000

This continuous tournament was played on Monday nights at the Fisherwick Club throughout the winter and finished on the $10^{\text {th }}$ April. Run on similar lines to the summer tournament at Civil Service, players had to play at least 12 games and compete on 2 out of the last 3 nights. The winning percentages were:

Steve Scannell scored $81 / 2$ out of 10 (W8 L1 D1) but did not play enough games to qualify for a prize. 19 competed, all but 3 playing at least the minimum number of games required.

McMASTER MATCHPLAY MASTERS (RAPIDPLAY) BELFAST 8-9 APRIL 2000
Richard McMaster had the idea of bringing together Ulster's top players in a matchplay format. Originally planned to be run on a knock-out basis, the event was changed into a double round all-play-all. Each player had half an hour on his clock and some hard fought and fascinating chess was produced in what is probably the strongest rapidplay event ever held in Ulster.

Avoiding the 3...e5 lines.
3...e6 4.g3 Bb4+ 5.Nbd2

Hoping to preserve the two bishops.

## 5...Qe7 6.Bg2 0-0 7.0-0 d6 8.a3 Bxd2 9.Bxd2 e5 10.d5 Nd4?!

Almost certainly losing the d-pawn. $10 \ldots \mathrm{Nd} 8$ is probably better.
11.Nxd4 exd4 12.Bg5?!

Wasting a move - but the black-squared bishop has few alternatives.

## 12...h6 13.Bxf6 Qxf6 14.Qd2 Bg4

Hoping to attack the semi-backward e-pawn and also possibly the potential attack on the b-pawn.

## 15.Rfe1 Rfe8 16.f3 Bf5 17.Rad1 Re3

Black has nothing else - the d-pawn is lost and now White is better.

## 18.Qxd4 Qxd4 19.Rxd4 Rae8 20.Kf2

Not 20.Rd2 because of $20 .$. Bd3 recovering the pawn.

## 20...Bc2 21.Rd2 Bb3 22.Rd3!

Probably the winning move.

The only chance.

## 11.d5 Nd4

Anything else is good for White. Although Black loses a pawn, paradoxically, he comes out better! It would probably be called a gambit, along the lines of other Nd4 King's Indian lines. Combined with the later sacrifice, which White declines, Black's position becomes very powerful.
12.Nxd4 exd4 13.Bxd4 c5! 14.Be3
$14 . d x c 6$ bxc6 ${ }^{3}$
14...h5! 15.g5
15.gxh5 Nxh5 ${ }^{3}$.

## 15...Nd7 16.Be2

White has nothing better. I would like to play $16 . f 4$ and nearly did so here until I saw $16 \ldots$ Bxc3 and $17 \ldots$ Rxe $4^{3}$.

Thematic and good.

## 18.Rdf1

Again White wants to play $18 . f 4$ but it is still premature.

## 18...b4?!

There are some lines in this opening where $18 \ldots$...bxc4 is not good. Here, however, it is probably best.

## 19.Nd1 a5 $20 . f 4$

During the game (and until now!) I thought 20.Nf2 was a mistake, thinking after 20...a4 21.f4 Ng4 Black was better. I completely overlooked 20.Nf2 covers g4 as well as e4. This means $20 . f 4$ is a mistake.

## 20...Ng4 21.Bxg4 hxg4?!

Black doesn't take advantage of White's 20.f4. 21...Bxg4! is better, with perhaps an unclear position.
$22 . f 5$
White is now probably better.

## 22...Rxe4 23.f6 Rxc4+ 24.Kb1 Bf5+ 25.Ka1?

An horrendous oversight. I looked at the position for a couple of minutes and thought I had no choice and played 25.Ka1 missing 25.Rxf5! and 26.fxg7².

## 25...Rc2 26.Qe1 Bxf6 27.gxf6 Qxf6 28.Rf2

Not 28.Bg5 Qxg5 29.hxg5 Rc1 mate.

## 28...Rc4 29.Qd2 a4 30.Bg5 Qg7 31.Ne3 Rd4 32.Qc1

32.Nxf5 Rxd2 33.Nxg7 Rxf2 wins for Black.

## 32...a3 33.Nxf5 gxf5 34.Rxf5 Qg6 35.Rhf1 axb2+ 36.Qxb2 Qxf5??

Probably a time pressure mistake forgetting about the bishop. In simple terms, a losing blunder.
